Registration

Check-in will be at the venue. All coaches should be checking in for all students. All volunteers should check in for their assignments at the designated time and location. Coaches should pick up lunch tickets for the students. Please check for spelling errors of the student names and give them back to the coordinator if corrections are needed. All students, guests and coaches must remain outside the venue until told otherwise (start of testing).

Site Access

All students, guests and coaches are free to be on CBU campus throughout the day. All students, guests and coaches are welcome to observe the Countdown Round and Awards Ceremony inside the venue. Students, parents, and coaches are not allowed inside the Grading Room at any time. Once the Proctors dismiss the students, they may go outside the venue for their breaks.

Testing Format

Competing students should meet outside the venue at 9:00 am to enter the venue for the Sprint Round. The procedures for each test will be presented by the coordinator. The individual competitors not taking the Team test will exit the venue after the Target Round. The Countdown Round is a fast-paced one-on-one competition. If guests can only be at one part of the event, this is it. The rules for the Countdown

Round will be presented to the students and audience. Please refer to the Mathcounts Handbook for rules. The coordinator will make all decisions affecting the results of the competition.

Student Supplies

Students are expected to provide their own pencils, erasers, and calculators. Scratch paper will be provided at the event.

Food

Lunch will be provided for all registered students and coaches with a ticket at Alumni Dining Commons. You can bring your own, if you want. No food or drinks except bottled water will be allowed in the testing area. Food and drinks are available for purchase at Alumni Dining Commons for Coaches, Volunteers, parents, and Guests. Coaches and Guests that would like to drink coffee are encouraged to purchase it at the Alumni Dining Commons, there are no coffee making facilities available at the competition venue.

Restrooms

Restrooms are available in the building.

Countdown Round

The Countdown Round will consist of the top 16 individual scorers from the morning written round competition against each other in a “Sweet 16” format. The students will be competing only for awards and prizes. The results of the Countdown Round will not have an impact on the advancement to the National.

What Coaches need to do prior to the competition?

1. Provide students and guests the directions to CBU.
2. Complete and sign the photo-video release form (CSPEEF.org) for each coach and student and turn in when checking-in on competition day.

What coaches need to do on the day of the competition?

1. Make sure all students are registered and get student lunch tickets
2. Help make sure students get back into the testing area promptly after breaks
3. Stress that students are not to verbalize answers during the Countdown Round
4. Pick up your Tally Sheets after the awards ceremony
